- Describe the function of the Bill of Lading as well as the role of the different types of Charter Parties.
- Discuss the various international conventions that are related to shipping
- Explain the different types of ship registry and the importance of classification societies
- Identify who are the principal and intermediaries in the shipping industry as well as the differences between this two group
